Prelude

Welcome and Announcements

Welcome to our Good Friday Tenebrae Service. The word Tenebrae comes from the Latin word for "darkness" and is a unique service to Christianity as we remember what Jesus Christ has done for us through his life and his death. By extinguishing lights throughout the service and reading the scriptures of Jesus' seven last words from the cross, let us remember and reflect together that Christ has come, the light of the world, but the world has loved the darkness and still tries to extinguish his light.

Opening Prayer

Today we pause to remember your sacrificial love
That shone light into the darkness,
That brought life from such emptiness,
That revealed hope out of devastation,
That spoke truth through incrimination,
That released freedom in spite of imprisonment,
And brought us forgiveness instead of punishment.

Scripture Reading

Isaiah 53:1-6 "IWho has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground. He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain. Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem. Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all."

John 19:1-3, 16-18

Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. ² The soldiers twisted together a crown of thorns and put it on his head. They clothed him in a purple robe ³ and went up to him again and again, saying, "Hail, king of the Jews!" And they slapped him in the face. ¹⁶ Finally Pilate handed him over to them to be crucified. So the soldiers took charge of Jesus. ¹⁷ Carrying his own cross, he went out to the place of the Skull (which in Aramaic is called Golgotha). ¹⁸ There they crucified him, and with him two others—one on each side and Jesus in the middle.
